TRADITIONAL PROGRAM

Bachelor of Science in Nursing. . . Graduates receive a BSN degree and are eligible to apply for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses.

DISTANCE PROGRAMS

Online and hybrid programs designed to allow nurses to continue working while completing an advanced degree.

RN MOBILITY

RN to BSN or RN to BSN/MSN. . . RNs who hold an associate degree or hospital diploma may choose either track to a higher degree.

GRADUATE

Master of Science in Nursing, Nurse Practitioner. . . prepares advanced practice registered nurses (APRN) for dual certification in mental health and primary care.

Master of Science in Nursing, Clinical Nurse Leader. . . prepares expert clinicians who design, implement and evaluate care management.

Master of Science in Nursing, Case Management. . . prepares nurses to assume leadership positions in health care administration and case management services.

EdD for Nurse Educators. . . prepares nurse educators to work as scholars, researchers, policy makers and institutional leaders.

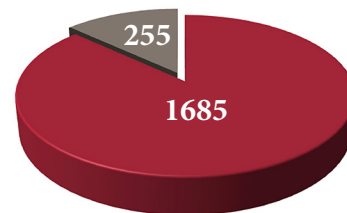
Doctor of Nursing Practice. . . prepares nurses at the highest level in specialty practice and healthcare leadership.

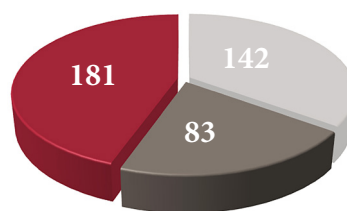
