Twelve hours in Humanities (HU) are required to graduate. If a student elects to complete two history courses, s/he must complete at least one additional HU course to fulfill UA core requirement. Students electing to pursue two history courses must complete this requirement in sequence. Students electing to pursue two literature courses do not have to complete this requirement in sequence.
